Code of Conduct for Children

We want every child to come to Camp and have a great time and feel safe and happy. This means that all of us at Camp need to do our very best to make this happen by using kind words and kind actions.

Everyone who comes to camp, both adults and children, must:

- Be welcoming and accepting of other people, even if they are different to ourselves in some way
- Not use language that is unkind, or makes other people feel left out, in particular where this is because of:
 - The colour of their skin
 - Their religion
 - Their gender identity
 - Their disability
 - Their appearance
 - Who they choose to love
- Not bully people
- Not make people do things they don't want to do, or that makes them feel uncomfortable or sad

The group leaders will:

- Organise lots of games and activities so you can have fun
- Be kind, cheerful and helpful
- Support you in your group so that if you are unhappy, poorly or worried we can sort it out
- Deal with anyone who does not follow the code of conduct so that Camp is not spoiled for everyone else
- Keep checking how you are and how you feel and at the end of Camp ask you what else we need to do to make Camp even more brilliant

We ask you to:

- Join in and have a fun time at Camp
- Follow the instructions from the group leaders so that we can keep you safe
- Tell someone if you feel pressured to do something you don't want to do
- Tell someone if you are upset or worried or feeling ill
- Be kind to others and tell the group leaders if you see someone being unkind or someone who is upset
- Be respectful to each other and the group leaders and not use bad language
- Have the best summer ever while you are at Camp

And remember that your group leader is always there for you. You can also go to First Aid and talk to Gwen, Fran or Jane.
